

HYMN (on next page) WINCHESTER NEW On Jordan's Bank the Baptist's Cry



Music Spotlight: Anthem at the Offering

Christian Cosas is a keyboardist and conductor, well versed in many different musical styles, including gospel, chant, and folk music. This piece uses one of the "O" antiphons of Advent and gradually builds harmonies, voice by voice, as if to show our prayers ascending to God. Listen especially for the difference between the beginning of the piece, which is an extended address to God with few words ("O Oriens"), and the middle of the piece, which elaborates on our supplication.
