A prolific poet, Langston Hughes was an important figure in the Harlem Renaissance, writing in the innovative style of "jazz poetry." This poem, "Prayer," asks God to embrace those who are typically cast out of society; it also calls us to love our neighbors as God loves us. Listen to how the piano accompaniment uses dissonant harmonies to illustrate the plight of the needy.
