Music Spotlight: Solo after the Baptism

Max Bruch was a German Romantic composer whose works included symphonies, orchestral suites, solo works, chamber music, and operas. While he was overshadowed during his lifetime by his more famous contemporary, Johannes Brahms, Bruch received praise for his compositional style, especially for chorus and orchestra. Today's piece, *Kol Nidrei*, is a set of variations on two Jewish melodies, the first of which comes from the "Kol Nidre" declaration recited on Yom Kippur. Listen for the different registers (higher, middle, and lower notes of the cello's range) in which the melodies occur, and notice how they interact with expressive characteristics, such as dynamics (loudness and softness).

His writing has been featured in such publications as *Sojourners Magazine*, *Daily Good*, *Christianity Today's Leadership Journal*, *Chronicle of Higher Education*, *The Huffington Post*, *The Christian Century*, *The Philadelphia Inquirer*, *The Forward*, *Democratic Left*, and *Slate*. He is the author of five books, including, most recently, *Black Theology as Mass Movement*, *Pond River Ocean Rain*, and *The Bottom: A Theopoetic of the Streets*. He shares life with his beloved wife, Dr. Lia C. Howard, and their three daughters.

A Note on Ministry Age Groups and Transitions. The transition from Children's to Youth Ministry is an exciting and significant discernment opportunity! Generally, the CFM recommends 11-year-olds in the 5th grade use our 9-to-11-year-old Children's Sunday School class for their capstone experience in the children's ministry. 6th graders who are 11 are welcome to remain in Children's Ministry or explore Youth Ministry. We encourage open conversations between parents, kids, and ministry leaders to ensure a supportive and personalized transition consider their spiritual and emotional readiness, as well as social comfort, as indicators for knowing when to cross this threshold.
