## NEWS FROM THE CROSSROADS

#### From the Pastor

Seth Godin tells a story about a time when the Air Force faced a challenge. In the 1950s, airplane crashes were on the rise—many of them preventable. Gilbert Daniels was assigned to investigate whether something in the plane's design was contributing to these accidents. What he discovered was surprising: the cockpit seats no longer fit the size of the pilots.

Over the course of thirty years, the average size of Air Force pilots had changed. To address the issue, Daniels measured hundreds of pilots using seventeen key physical metrics and calculated an average to redesign the cockpit. But when it came time to fit pilots into the new average cockpit, fewer than 3% actually matched the "average" size. In trying to fit everyone, the result was that no one really fit.

Since the fire, our church has continued to attract visitors. At first, this surprised me. We felt fragile, still nursing a deep wound. We were in a new space where it didn't feel like we fit. I remain deeply grateful for the hospitality of Penn Wynne Presbyterian Church—their generosity has been a steady blessing. And yet, it has been a challenge to be guests week after week. I worried that visitors would sense our struggle and turn away. I feared that our pain would be off-putting.

But I've come to understand something else entirely: the pain and struggle haven't been deterrents—they've been the draw.

Too often, churches—often in a sincere pursuit of excellence—send an unintended message that people must have it all together to belong. There's an unspoken assumption that one must be shaped a certain way to fit the community. But this season of displacement has taught us something powerful: fitting in is not a prerequisite for belonging. When people walk through our doors, what they need to hear is this—you are welcome here, just as you are. You're not being asked to fit a mold or meet a standard. You're being invited into community, into grace.

This is our gospel message to everyone who enters our church: You belong here. Not because you fit our categories, but because you are the beloved of God.
