We are adapting the traditions we have come to know and love, and creating other experiences to build brand new memories. Join us! Below is a list of Advent/ Christmas events at OPC.

Advent

<u>December 6</u> - Advent II - The second candle in the Advent wreath, the candle of peace, will be lighted by the Long family. Adam Hearlson will preach. Messiah Sing at 3:00 p.m.-see page 2 for more details on Messiah Sing.

<u>December 13</u> - Advent III - The third candle in the Advent wreath, the candle of joy, will be lighted by the Carroll/Goodwin family. We will also have the "Greening of the Church" adapted for our new conditions. We can't have a parade of poinsettias through the sanctuary or sprays of evergreens hung from church rafters. However, we have learned well over the past few months that our homes can be sacred worship spaces, and the "church" is more about the people than the building. So on December 13, please join virtual worship with your homemade chrismons (from supplies in your Advent bag!) and prepare to reimagine the Greening of the Church as we learn more about Advent season symbols.

<u>December 20</u> - Advent IV - The fourth candle in the Advent wreath, the candle of love, will be lighted by the Goedde family.

<u>December 21</u> - Service of the Longest Night at 7:00 pm - Adam will lead this service of reflection, compassion, and healing specially planned for those who find the Advent and Christmas seasons difficult.




Sunday, December 6 3:00 p.m.

Green Team News

Our bench made from recycled plastic has been ordered and should arrive in a month or two. Thank you for bringing in the 500 lbs of clean soft plastic that made this bench possible! So far Overbrook has collected 109.6 lbs towards earning a second bench. A great effort considering being in a pandemic. Christmas, with its deluge of bubble wrap and plastic bags will give Overbrook members a renewed source of plastic to recycle!

Due to Covid-19, not all Giant, Acme, and Home Depot stores are currently collecting plastic bags. Check with your local stores to see if they are currently participating. The Giant store in Wynnewood has doubled the amount of plastic collection containers. Several Acme stores in our area also continue to have collection bins.

The following are soft plastics acceptable for recycling: grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood bags, pellet bags, ziplock bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, salt bags, and cereal bags. *All materials must be clean, dry and free of food residue*.

We will record the weight and send it to the Trex Company for credit towards bench #2. Thank you for supporting this effort!

Finance Committee

As we shared in last month's newsletter, our revised 2020 budget shows up ending the year with a deficit due to three factors: 1) the loss of rental revenue, 2) property needs, and 3) personnel support. While we were expecting to run a deficit of \$136,000 for 2020, we have not yet withdrawn any funds from the Endowment. We believe that the generosity we have seen from the congregation will reduce the amount that we will require from the Endowment this year. So far, indications are positive.

This year we also received a PPP loan which covered the church staff payroll for a period of approximately 2.5 months. The forgiveness application for this PPP loan was submitted earlier this month. We are hopeful that we will not have to pay back any portion of the loan, which will also help reduce the amount needed from the Endowment.

When we reflect on all that has been accomplished this year to aid members of our local community, maintain our historic building, pay our staff and generally weather the impacts of a pandemic, we are pleased with our current financial situation. We realize that we are entering the new year with as many unknowns as we faced in 2020, and will do our best to predict the financial needs of the church in the next budget. If you are planning to give to OPC next year, we would ask that you prayerfully consider and pledge the amount that you feel most comfortable giving, as the pledged revenue is one piece of information that we can consider "almost certain" in this world of uncertainty, and every little bit helps.

We would like to wrap up the year with a big thank you to everyone in the congregation for your kindness and ongoing generosity, which continue to breathe life into our mission and ministry here at Overbrook Church.
