NEWS FROM THE CROSSROADS

Dear OPC Saints,

During the month of October, OPC will again celebrate a Season of Creation. Beginning with the Feast of St Francis on October 4th, we will spend four Sundays to reflect on God's creation, to rejoice in its beauty, and to commit ourselves to protecting it. This ecumenical movement spans across denominations, with Christians from all corners of the world joining together in prayer, worship, and action.

The Season of Creation began in 1989 when the Orthodox Church proclaimed September 1st as a day of prayer for the environment. It has since grown into an ecumenical movement embraced by various Christian traditions, including the Roman Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, and Reformed churches, among many others. The movement seeks to deepen our understanding of God's creation and our role as stewards of the Earth.

Why Should We Celebrate?

1. A Call to Stewardship

Throughout the Bible, we see a clear mandate for humans to care for creation. From the opening chapters of Genesis, where God entrusts Adam and Eve with the care of the garden, to the Psalms that sing of the beauty of creation, Scripture reminds us that the Earth is a gift from God. By celebrating the Season of Creation, we reconnect with our biblical calling to be responsible stewards, safeguarding the environment for future generations.

2. A Time for Reflection and Repentance

The Season of Creation also offers a moment for repentance. As we witness the impacts of climate change, environmental degradation, and loss of biodiversity, we are reminded of the ways humanity has harmed the Earth. This season encourages us to reflect on our own actions, seek forgiveness, and commit to changing the way we live to honor God's creation.

3. Solidarity with the Global Church

When we participate in the Season of Creation, we join millions of Christians around the world who are united in their commitment to ecological justice. In many parts of the world, communities are already feeling the harsh effects of environmental neglect. Through prayer, worship, and action, we stand in solidarity with those who are vulnerable to these crises and advocate for a world where God's creation is cherished and preserved.

4. Celebrating the Creator

Finally, this season is a celebration of God the Creator. As we reflect on the beauty of the world around us—the forests, oceans, animals, and skies—we are reminded of God's boundless creativity and love. The Season of Creation invites us to worship with gratitude and awe for the wonders of the world God has made.

The Season of Creation is an opportunity for us to renew our commitment to God's creation, to listen for the Spirit's guidance in how we care for the world, and to act in faith alongside our global siblings. I look forward to celebrating another Season of Creation with you!

A Note on Ministry Age Groups and Transitions

The transition from Children's to Youth Ministry is an exciting and significant discernment opportunity! But when exactly is the right time to cross this threshold? Everyone is a little bit different. Generally, the CFM recommends 11-year-olds in the 5th grade utilize our 9-11-year-old Children's Sunday School class for their capstone experience in the children's ministry. 6th graders who are 11 are welcome to remain in Children's Ministry or explore Youth Ministry.

We encourage open conversations between parents, kids, and ministry leaders to ensure a supportive and personalized transition consider their spiritual and emotional readiness, as well as social comfort, as indicators for knowing when to cross this threshold.


