Dear OPC Saints,

As we embark on the new program year, I'm thrilled to invite our entire congregation to join us in a season of revitalization! Since the fire, our dedicated church leaders have been hard at work with remediators, insurance adjusters, and architects to prepare the way for something truly transformative—a collaborative conversation about the future of our beloved church building. We have been granted an incredible, once-in-a-generation opportunity to reshape our sacred space to better serve our mission.

The gospel teaches us that revitalization is at the core of our faith. What is broken can be restored. What is lifeless can be revived. Right now, our church stands empty, awaiting our collective touch to bring it back to life. The sanctuary bears the scars of the fire, and the program wing is damaged by smoke. But with the power of the Holy Spirit, and the strength of our community, we will breathe new life into these spaces.

This fall, we're launching five exciting revitalization teams, each inspired by the dreams our congregation shared last spring:

The fire task force continues to meet weekly with the public adjusters. They received and reviewed our architect's 300-page proposal. The fire task force and Young Adjusters are working with Church Mutual to come to an agreement regarding cost estimates for rebuilding OPC.

Mimi Winkler's proposal for rebuilding the offices for the staff has been accepted and actual construction is set to begin shortly.
