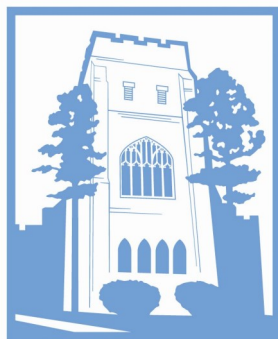

On September 24th at 6:00pm, the church will gather in-person and online to discuss the mission and vision of the church. As you probably remember, we were supposed to have this conversation at the end of March 2020, a month that will exist in infamy as long as I have memory.

A lot has happened since the time we were supposed to meet. Our lives have changed, and it ought not surprise us that the priorities of February 2020 are perhaps not the same priorities of September 2021. The world feels more divided than ever. The needs are as acute as ever. Gun violence is rising. Neighbors are still hungry. Addiction surrounds us. In such a time, I am reminded of St. Ignatius’ good wisdom, “Seek the way that works.”

That is what our conversation will seek to do--seek a way that works. We will seek to find a way to be the hands and feet of the risen Christ to a world in need. Our aim is to sort out how we might be the loving presence of Christ in this world, to each other and to neighborhood.

Lately, I have been studying the book of Ruth, which is, line for line, probably my favorite story in the Bible. The book of Ruth is a theological exploration of the Hebrew word *Hesed*. *Hesed* is often translated as loving kindness. Really, it is a term to describe all the things that go over and above what the law prescribes. The Hebrew law had a prescription for right living, but there was always the option to pursue something more generous, more loving, and more gracious than the law--that’s *Hesed*.

This is my hope, that we are a congregation filled to the brim with loving kindness and overflowing generosity. I want us to do more than is expected and dream bigger than seems reasonable. I want us to figure out how our expression of *Hesed* might look like in a world divided, hungry, and dying. I want us to be like Ruth, who crosses boundaries with grace, who seeks the way of love and grace, and faces trials with strength and tenderness.

I don’t know the exact shape of what that will look like, but I am confident that WE know. The most compelling and inspiring visions grow from amid the congregation. On **Friday, September 24 at 6:00pm**, the church will gather to discuss and brainstorm our common future. The success of this process is directly related to gathering the largest possible group to this conversation. Childcare will be available. Members and friends of OPC alike are invited. Online options will be provided.

Come and be a part of the amazing future we are writing together with God. Together we will begin building a vision of *Hesed* in our hearts, in our homes, and in our world.

Outdoor Sunday School | Starting Sunday, September 12th at 10:30

Following a successful and well-received outdoor Vacation Bible School, Christian Education will aim to host two or three outdoor Sunday School sessions per month at OPC! These interactive learning sessions will feature rich biblical storytelling and engaging activities, and will aim to foster a safe space for social-emotional learning and interaction. Registration will be available soon. There are two paths for participation:

- **Indoor -> Outdoor:** Learners may arrive at 10:30 for indoor worship, stay to the children's message, and then walk with their teachers and leaders to the outdoor learning space.
- **Outdoor Only:** Learners arrive at 10:45 in the OPC playground. Indoor participants will meet the outdoor participants.
- **Inclement Weather:** Should inclement weather remain in the forecast after 9:30 AM on any given Sunday, all learning will most likely occur in an indoor, ventilated space.

Sense of Spiritual Direction

The isolation of the pandemic gave many of us an abundance of time and silence. With my time and silence, I made the bold, and possibly erratic decisions to move out of my neighborhood and comfort zones, try new recipes, and find long-deceased kinfolk on Ancestry.com. I also listened in that silence and prayed for a sense of direction.

As a visual learner, my childhood sense of direction was often rooted in landmarks, rather than the actual quadrants of a compass or direction of the sun. To find my way home, I knew to turn left just past the flower shop, and then make a quick right at the Atlantic Gas Station. NSEW were interesting, yet meaningless letters. In the isolation of these past 19 months, I lost my superficial landmarks, yet I gained a greater sense of spiritual direction. I did so through discernment, study, and most especially by the grace of God. Throughout the past academic year, and with the encouragement of Pastor Adam, I studied at Shalem Institute for Spiritual Formation. I learned to be silent; I learned to listen; and I learned to be open to God's spiritual direction. I would like to share what I have learned with you.

For me, spiritual direction is a compassionate listening and prayer partnership given, freely and confidentially, by one child of God to another. It is the asking and answering of questions of faith; it is the journey of discovering God's invitation in one's life. As Parish Care Associate...as your fellow congregant...I invite you to join me for shared listening and prayer, and for the realization of God's will. During the week, I will be at church on Mondays from 9:00 AM until noon; and on Wednesdays from 8:30AM until 10:30 AM. I am also available evenings for "zoom" time.
